

WHAT'S COMING UP IN 2010

JANUARY/FEBRUARY

BLUEGRASS MUSIC: Bluegrass-only festivals are a dying breed, replaced by multi-genre music fests where purists get only a sampling. But you can still find the real deal in small-town jam clubs and festivals in rural settings.

SHREVEPORT ARTS & CULTURE: This city has more to offer than its usual draw: gaming.

GRAND BAHAMA ISLAND: A couple seeks out the real Bahamas through the volunteer People-to-People program.

DAYTRIP-WEST TEXAS TRIANGLE: The tiny communities of Marfa, Alpine, and Fort Davis are linked by US 90 and Texas 118 and 17. We'll tell you what's there.

MARCH/APRIL

SEA TURTLES OF SOUTH PADRE ISLAND: Conservationists incubate turtle eggs, then release the hatchlings along the seashore. You can watch these creatures return to the water.

HAWAII-BEYOND THE BEACH: A roundup of ways to get active in the Islands, from tubing down a sugarcane flume to kayaking the Hanalei River to hiking through lava tubes.

MORE THAN BARBECUE IN KANSAS CITY, MO: Our writer will explore this underrated food city's other cuisines.

DAYTRIP-SALADO: This charming village grew around the Sterling C. Robertson home and plantation, and was prominent on the Chisholm Trail. Today's visitors find shops, galleries, historic lodging, and more.

MAY/JUNE

JULY/AUGUST

HOUSEBOATING ON LAKE AMISTAD: Located on the US/Mexico border, the pristine Lake Amistad has world-class fishing and provides access to two major rock-art sites
